- 3. In the event of a joint placing, the number of firsts will be used to decide.
- 4. All exhibits in the Cookery Section MUST BE COVERED.
- 5. All entries must have been grown or made by the exhibitor and all garments must be unworn.
- 6. Presentation of the trophies will take place in the Horticultural Tent at 3.45 pm prompt. Prize money will be paid in the tent after the presentations.
- 7. No exhibits to be removed from the tent before 4.00 pm.
- 8. All exhibits to be collected from the tent by 5.00 pm.
- 9. All exhibitors to be responsible for their exhibits.
- 10. NO MORE THAN 3 ENTRIES PER CLASS ACCEPTED.

Entries to be received on the morning of the show.
