RULES

Because of the Brucellosis Scheme the Cattle Section is open to animals from Accredited Herds only.

- 1. No prize shall be given when the Judges consider there is insufficient merit, or when an exhibitor has been guilty of fraudulent practice.
- 2. The Committee will not be responsible for any accidents to persons or property on the premises in which the Show is held and in which the cars are parked.
- 3. All animals are to be on the Field by 9.00am Judging will start promptly.
- 4. The Judge's decision will be final in all matters of dispute.
- 5. All monies to be payable to "Nevern Agricultural & Horticultural Society".
- 6. Entries taken on the day will pay an extra £2 per class.

No late entries will be accepted on the day unless that competitor has already entered a class before the closing date.

(Show Jumping Classes enter on the day)

- 7. The Committee will not be responsible for any error which may appear in the Schedule or Catalogue, or for any entry made in the wrong Class, and reserves the right to amend the same in any way whatsoever.
- 8. All animals must be treated as being in the sole charge of the exhibitor or handler during the whole of the Show, and the Committee shall not be responsible for any loss or damage. Unruly animals will be turned out of the field. All bulls must have two attendants whilst in the Show ring.
- All Bulls must have two handlers. Handlers must be 16 years old and over on the day of the show.
- 10. Only the signed award of the Judges will be accepted by the Secretaries as evidence that a prize has been awarded.
- 11. On arrival at the Show, all exhibits in the Cattle and Sheep Classes are to be tied or penned in the appropriate section of the ground set aside for the particular breed or class and are not to remain inside the transport vehicles.
- 12. All objections must be made in writing and handed to the Secretary on the day of the

Show, and any persons lodging an objection must deposit £10 with the Secretary, which sum will be forfeited if the objection or dispute is found to be frivolous, and all objections and questions of dispute shall be referred to the Committee whose decision shall be final.

- 13.It is the responsibility of all owners/exhibitors to ensure that their animals have adequate insurance.
- 14. Stallions, colts not to be ridden or led by juniors who have not attained their 16th birthday on the day of the show.
- Local classes exhibit or exhibitor to reside in the parish of Nevern, Meline, Bayvil, Moylegrove, Llanychllwydog, Eglwyswrw, Brynberian, Cilgwyn, Newport & Dinas.
- Paying competitors have two free entry passes to the show. Additional tickets must be purchased for anyone else accompanying a competitor at the Show.

BIOSECURITY AT NEVERN SHOW

Due to the current regulations governing cattle and sheep at agricultural shows, the show field has been designed to conform. Please help us and yourselves by following the directions given by signs and stewards. Thank you for your cooperation.

NO CONTAMINATED VEHICLES will be allowed on the show fields.

Footwear must have soles for scrubbing and disinfecting.

All cattle ear-tags must be recorded for BCMS.
